 - identifying appropriate methods for evaluating social and economic value of information across broad range of actors and contexts.

- Table 2: What can enhance the transition of PPP outcomes into better WWIC user experiences?
- **Table 3:** What Antarctic WWIC information is important in your work, and why?
- Table 4: What will be the most meaningful contributions from the PPP for individual WWIC user groups and society more largely?
 - (You may want to consider: What aspects of Antarctic WWIC information/ services can be most easily tailored to different user requirements [format, scope, spatial or temporal coverage, resolution, etc.]?)


