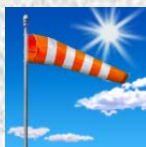
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Weak low pressure on the far side of the Ross Ice Shelf is leaving the Ross Island region with another mostly clear and mostly calm day today. Later tonight, a minor trough from the low will brush by, increasing the winds a bit, and helping to keep temperatures fairly warm.
