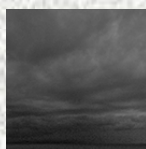
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

High pressure over the western Ross Ice Shelf and Sea is weakening slightly, allowing temperatures to moderate a bit. However this is allowing an area of low pressure to develop over the central Ross Ice shelf increasing clouds over the region. Expect relatively light winds, with a few flurries today.
