REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure is still in place on the far side of the Ross Ice Shelf. It's just far enough away that Ross Island will fluctuate in and out of its influence. Today will be a breezy but mostly clear day, while tomorrow will see another round of stronger winds and snow as another lobe of the low pressure system swings through.
