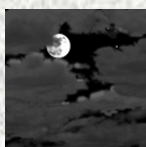
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A low pressure system in the eastern Ross Sea is moving SW towards the Ice Shelf producing extensive cloud cover, periods of light snow, and one more day of above average temperatures. S-SE winds will vary throughout the day with periods of strong gusts.
