REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Expect a bit of everything this weekend, weather-wise. Winds will be mostly gusty due to strong cyclonic flow on the ice shelf and temperatures will fall a few degrees, so low wind chills are on the way. We'll also contend with a pair of low centers. The first is moving off the ice shelf this morning – so we'll actually have slightly lower winds (but colder temperatures) this afternoon and evening. The second starts doing its worst around noon tomorrow, bringing snow and wind through the end of the day.
