Low pressure east of Ross Island out on the shelf is spinning troughs around it. Expect gusty winds, clouds, colder temperatures and wind chills, and occasional snow falling throughout the day/evening. Tomorrow the full effects of the low will be felt with stronger southerly winds, snow and blowing snow.
