REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure streaks from east to west just north of the Shelf. This “cold” system brings in quite a bit of snow fall, blowing snow, strong winds and cold air. Mass hysteria, Adélies and Orcas living together! Low visibilities with blowing snow. Hoodie weather turns into Big Red weather by the end of the evening with a 30-40 degree temperature drop.
