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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Deep low pressure over the northeastern Ross Sea is extending a trough onto the Ross Ice Shelf and keeping the local area under gusty southerly winds, cloudy skies and poor visibility due to snow and blowing snow. There may be periodic improvement as this low begins to recede, but another low near Cape Adare is essentially replacing the energy. Unsettled weather is expected to continue through tomorrow.
