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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A strong low pressure system is rapidly crossing the Drake Passage from the western Chilean coast today, and is now expected to pass further north of the station than previously forecasted. This will delay the initial onset of winds and give them a more east-southeast component than typical. Expect conditions to deteriorate rapidly by noon with gale to storm force winds and snow midday Wednesday into early Thursday morning.
