**PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION**

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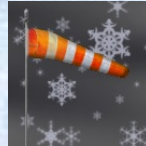
**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Somewhat of a reprieve in the weather for a change, although still very cloudy with light snow lingering in the area today as the Low pulls off to the east. The next major Low approaches the Bellingshausen Sea region from the west tonight. The associated cold frontal boundary swinging out ahead of it will begin affecting the Anvers Island region around mid-morning on Tuesday, bringing stronger winds and reduced visibility in snow once again. The Low ends up crashing into the Peninsula before midnight between Alexander and Adelaide Islands to the south, keeping snow over the area well into Wednesday.
