Low pressure continues to press in from the west keeping an abundance of moisture over the region, with periods of reduced visibility in a mix of rain and snow expected into tomorrow evening. The Low tracks over the Peninsula late night tonight, moving east of the Peninsula by mid-morning on Monday, with winds shifting from a northwesterly flow to a southwesterly flow, bringing a slight cooling trend and drier conditions for Monday into Tuesday.
