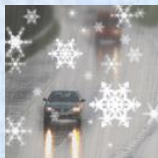

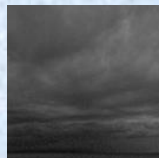
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Decaying low in the Bellingshausen Sea will slowly loosen its grip on the peninsula. Cloudy conditions and sporadic periods of precipitation will continue into the night, moderate winds during the forecast period, and possible glimpses of sunshine on Wednesday are not out of the question.

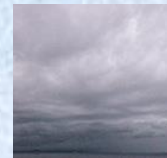
