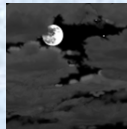
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A low pressure system is weakening as it moves into the southern Bellingshausen Sea bringing increasing NE winds tonight. A second, stronger low will approach from the SW Pacific, affecting the northern Peninsula late Tuesday night, bringing warmer temperatures and snow.
