REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Fair weather with mild temperatures and light winds will continue today, as a high pressure ridge remains along the Antarctic Peninsula. A “warm front” will move into the region from the northwest tonight and Tuesday, bringing windy conditions with increasing clouds and a chance of light snow. Despite the slightly warmer temperatures aloft, the increase in winds will make it feel a bit colder than today.
