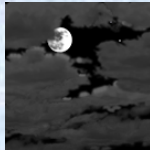
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Strong northeast winds and snowy conditions are expected today as a weak cold front approaches from the west. Palmer will then lie between two low pressure systems tonight and tomorrow, a small one moving from the Drake Passage into the Atlantic and a larger system taking shape as it slowly approaches the Antarctic Peninsula from the west.
