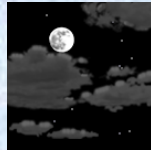
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Fair weather, light winds, and seasonal temperatures are expected today and tonight, as a weak high pressure ridge builds across the northern half of the Antarctic Peninsula. Northeast winds and clouds will increase Thursday afternoon as a low pressure system approaches slowly from the west. Temperatures in the lowest 1500 feet of the atmosphere are likely to warm to a degree above the melting point tomorrow, so expect a mix of light rain and/or snow tomorrow afternoon.

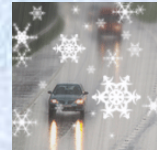
