The most recent low pressure system will move through the Drake Passage bringing a short reprieve. The next system will track more southerly into the southeast Bellingshausen Sea Monday afternoon. Conditions will continue to vary widely from relative calm with light rain to predominantly strong NW - NE winds and periods of snow mixed with rain and sleet for the 24-36 hours.
