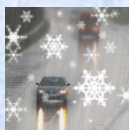

REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

An approaching low pressure system will track into the southeast Bellingshausen Sea and into the Eight's Coast today. Conditions will continue to vary widely from relative calm with periods of light rain to predominantly strong NW - NE winds and periods of moderate rain mixed with snow and sleet for the 24-36 hours. Winds will back briefly to the southwest Tuesday evening bringing low temps into the mid-upper 20's for a few hours.

Sky: Cloudy to Mostly Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 2 – 4 due to rain, mixed w/ snow, becoming unrestricted afternoon

Wind (kts): NE 10-15gusting to 20, becoming NW 8-13 afternoon

Max Temp: 2°C / 36°F

Min Wind Chill: -6°C / 21°F

Sky: Mostly Cloudy to Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, lowering 2 – 4 in mixed precipitation

Wind (kts): NW 8-13, becoming NE 15-25 w/ gust to 32. Increasing NE 25-40 gusting 50 overnight

Min Temp: -1°C / 30°F

Min Wind Chill: -11°C / 12°F

Sky: Cloudy, becoming Mostly cloudy late day

Visibility (SM): 1 – 2 due to rain mixed with snow, becoming unrestricted late day

Wind (kts): NE 25-40 gusting to 50. Backing NW 18-25 midday, becoming SW 8-15 by evening

Max Temp: 3°C / 37°F

Min Wind Chill: -15°C / 5°F
