Decreasing southwesterly winds and cooler temps are following the passage of low pressure into the Weddell Sea. High pressure will build over the region Friday afternoon and Saturday, bringing light winds, cool temps and periods of light snow. The relative calm will be brief, with winds increasing Late Saturday evening, and precipitation returning by Sunday morning
