PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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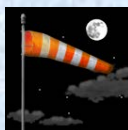
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

High pressure building into the western Bellingshausen Sea, in conjunction with deepening low pressure east of the Palmer Peninsula, will produce clearing skies, strong S-SE'erly winds and much colder temperatures Monday afternoon into Thursday. For vessel operations: Light, to occasional moderate icing potential exists in open waters west of Anvers Island.

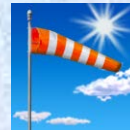
