REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure approaching from the west this morning brings cloudy skies, strengthened north-northeasterly winds by late morning and brief periods of light snow this afternoon into this evening. The Low takes more of a northeasterly turn and heads into the Drake Passage tomorrow morning, skirting Anvers Island just to the north, causing the winds to turn more to the east by morning, then shifting to the southwest late Saturday night as the Low pulls off to the northeast. Periods of light snow are expected to move through the area on Sunday.
