**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Low pressure stretching west-east through the Drake Passage slowly moves off to the east by this evening, keeping cloudy skies over the region through part of today, but the precipitation associated with this system should remain to the north. High pressure moves in over the area tonight, keeping things nice and quiet with diminished cloud cover and fairly light winds. The next system approaching from the northwest on Tuesday brings increasing winds by early afternoon, with visibility dropping hard by midnight as the next wave of precipitation hits.
