PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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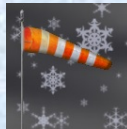
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure moving across the northern portion of the Palmer Peninsula this morning taking remnants of some moderate snow along with it. The next wave of moisture hits this evening into tomorrow morning, bringing some increased winds once again, along with some periods of reduced visibility in light snow. By midday on Sunday, things should begin to break out for a change, as the precipitation band moves off to the east over the Peninsula.

Sky: Cloudy, becoming Mostly Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasional 1 – 3 due to snow and mist

Wind (kts): NW-N 10 – 15, becoming N-NE 10 – 15

Max Temp: -2°C / 28°F

Min Wind Chill: -10°C / 14°F

Sky: Mostly Cloudy to Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasional 4 – 6 due to light snow

Wind (kts): N-NE 10 – 15 w/ gusts to 20, becoming 15 – 35 w/ gusts to 45

Min Temp: -3°C / 27°F

Min Wind Chill: -11°C / 12°F

Sky: Cloudy, becoming Mostly Cloudy late night

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasional 5 – 7 due to light snow

Wind (kts): NW-N 15 – 35 w/ gusts to 45, becoming N-NE 5 – 15

Max Temp: -1°C / 30°F

Min Wind Chill: -11°C / 12°F
