REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

High pressure and good weather this morning give way to a Low moving into the Bellingshausen Sea region later this morning, with an associated frontal boundary that pushes into the Anvers Island region by late afternoon / early evening timeframe. This system will bring very strong winds and reduced visibility in snow for tonight, with winds easing briefly tomorrow morning before increasing once again late afternoon. Snow continues into Tuesday with winds easing late morning.
