REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure just west of Alexander Island this morning will keep periods of light snow over the area off and on throughout the day. A ridge of High pressure builds in from the west overnight, with occasional periods of snow still lingering in the area. The next Low approaches on Tuesday evening from the west, bringing strong winds and a decent amount of snow into the region by early evening timeframe, which will once again severely reduce the visibility in snow / blowing snow.
