REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A few hours calm this afternoon and early evening will come to a screaming halt through midnight as the leading frontal boundary off a tightly wound, well-structured low pressure system crashes the peninsula. Expect high wind and snow tonight through tomorrow with precipitation likely becoming mixed by afternoon...

Sky: Cloudy, becoming Mostly Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasional 1-3 snow, fog early morning

Wind (kts): Variable 4-7

Max Temp: -1°C / 30°F

Min Wind Chill: -8°C / 18°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, becoming ½-2 snow, fog

Wind (kts): NE 6-12, becoming NE-E 30-50 occasional gust 60 near midnight, easing to NW-N 20-30

Min Temp: -1°C / 30°F

Min Wind Chill: -10°C / 14°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 1-3 snow, fog with a chance of rain/snow mixed

Wind (kts): NW-NE 25-40

Max Temp: 2°C / 32°F

Min Wind Chill: -8°C / 18°F
