REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure just west of Anvers Island comes crashing in by mid afternoon, bringing another round of strengthened winds and reduced visibility in snow. The Low moves off to the east this evening allowing weak High pressure to ridge in over the area, with much lighter winds and diminishing precipitation. The next wave of precipitation hits the area around midday to early afternoon tomorrow, bringing yet another surge of stronger winds and snow lasting well into Saturday morning.
