Low pressure moving off to the east allowing for improved conditions for most of today, although some light snow may develop later this afternoon into the early evening hours. The next wave of moisture moves in from the Bellingshausen Sea region late tomorrow afternoon into the evening hours, with periods of reduced visibility expected in light snow / fog as the wave moves through.
