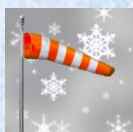

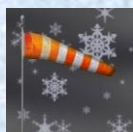
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Round after round of snow and wind will continue as the strong low pressure system continues to advance towards the Antarctic Peninsula. The next lobe of the system will ramp up the winds later today, and will dump even heavier snow tomorrow. Visibility will be hampered for most of today and tomorrow, varying between snow, blowing snow, sleet, and mist.

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, becoming 3 – 5 due to light snow, sleet, and mist

Wind (kts): NE 5-10, becoming NW 20-30, gusting to 35

Max Temp: 1°C / 34°F

Min Wind Chill: -13°C / 9°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 3 – 5 due to light snow, blowing snow, and mist, occasionally 1 – 3

Wind (kts): NE 10-20, becoming 20-30, gusting to 50

Min Temp: -3°C / 27°F

Min Wind Chill: -13°C / 9°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 1/2 – 2 due to snow, blowing snow, and sleet, occasionally 3 – 5

Wind (kts): NE 30-40, gusting to 50, becoming NW

Max Temp: 2°C / 36°F

Min Wind Chill: -14°C / 7°F
