REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Several waves of precipitation will affect Anvers Island over the next couple of days with cloudy skies and periods of reduced visibility in a mix of rain/snow expected into Sunday. Winds will be relatively light today, but will be increasing significantly overnight tonight through Saturday as the pressure gradient tightens over the region. Precipitation amounts increase as well tomorrow, which in turn will reduce visibility dramatically well into Sunday.

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasional 4-6 in rain/snow mixed

Wind (kts): Light / Variable, becoming N-NE 10-20, occasional 5-15

Max Temp: 4°C / 39°F

Min Wind Chill: -9°C / 16°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, becoming 3-5 in snow, w/ periods of 1/2-2

Wind (kts): N-NE 15-35 w/ gusts to 40

Min Temp: 1°C / 34°F

Min Wind Chill: -7°C / 19°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 1-3 in snow, becoming 5-7 mid to late afternoon

Wind (kts): N-NE 15-30 w/ gusts to 35, w/ periods of 10-20

Max Temp: 2°C / 36°F

Min Wind Chill: -6°C / 21°F
