Numerous waves of precipitation continue to hammer the Anvers Island region over the next couple of days as Low pressure systems move through the Bellingshausen Sea region and across the Peninsula. Cloudy skies and periods of reduced visibility in snow have become the norm, and will continue through Sunday.
