Low pressure in the Bellingshausen Sea region continues to keep a moist flow moving through the Anvers Island region into tonight, with conditions improving briefly after midnight. The next major Low moves in from the northwest on Tuesday morning bringing an increase in winds, precipitation and warming temperatures. As the Low moves into the Drake Passage late Tuesday night, the gradient weakens and the winds diminish.
