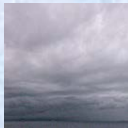

REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A high pressure ridge over the Antarctic Peninsula this morning will quickly retreat eastward, as a cold front approaches from the west. Clouds will increase later today, with frequent snow developing by tonight. Milder temperatures will be drawn southward overnight and early Sunday, as N-NE winds increase. The cold front will pass through Palmer late Sunday afternoon.

Sky: Increasing clouds

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted with occasional 4-6 in snow late

Wind (kts): N-NE 5-15

Max Temp: -2°C / 28°F

Min Wind Chill: -12°C / 11°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 4-6 with occasional 1-3 in snow

Wind (kts): NE 10-15, becoming N-NE 15-25 gusts to 35 late

Min Temp: -1°C / 30°F

Min Wind Chill: -9°C / 15°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 3-5 with occasional 1 or less in snow

Wind (kts): N-NE 20-30 gusts to 40, becoming NW-N 10-15 late

Max Temp: 1°C / 34°F

Min Wind Chill: -7°C / 19°F
