**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Low pressure in the Bellingshausen Sea pushes closer to the Antarctic Peninsula, bringing yet another round of strong winds and precipitation to Anvers Island. Due to the warm temperatures, another mix of rain and snow is in store, and will drastically reduce visibility at times.

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, occasional 2-4 rain/snow mixed

**Wind (kts):** NW-N 15-25

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, becoming 2-4 rain early morning

**Wind (kts):** N-NE 5-10, becoming NE-E 25-40

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, occasional 1/2-2 rain/snow mixed
