REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure driving down into the Bellingshausen Sea region today with waves of precipitation associated with it sweeping in from the west-northwest. This will keep cloudy skies over the area again today with periods of reduced visibility in rain into tomorrow. By tomorrow morning, a new Low forms just off the tip of South America, which then drops down over Anvers Island by midnight, bringing even more bands of precipitation into the region. About the only good news is the temperatures warm significantly today, into the mid 40's, then cool slightly tomorrow.
