Low pressure driving down from the north this morning currently moving through the Drake Passage, which will bring a bit more rain over the region into tomorrow as it becomes absorbed by a stronger, and deeper Low moving into the Bellingshausen Sea region today as well. Skies will remain cloudy for the most part, with periods of reduced visibility in rain (possible rain, snow mix tomorrow). Winds will be primarily from the north, strengthening tonight and then again diminishing tomorrow. The temperatures won't be as warm today, and cool somewhat through the period.
