## **REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Low pressure in the western Bellingshausen Sea brings a sweeping frontal boundary through the area this morning with increased north-northeasterly winds and some periods of light rain, switching over to snow by late afternoon/early evening as the temperatures drop off. The next Low passes to the north tomorrow, but the possibility of a few brief flurries are still possible, especially late evening.
