REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Wave of low pressure to the south moves east into the Weddell Sea setting the stage for a tight southwesterly gradient along the peninsula against a strong South Pacific high. Low clouds, fog, and snow drag through the area today and tonight with wind speeds increasing after midnight and a chance of breaks in the cloud cover tomorrow...

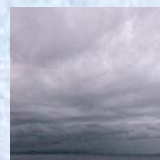
