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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A deepening Low continues to dig into the Bellingshausen Sea region this morning and ends up crashing into Alexander Island well to the south, with the associated frontal boundary sweeping across the western side of the Peninsula today and tonight. This will keep somewhat strengthened northwesterly winds and reduced visibility in snow/rain/fog over the area into tomorrow morning. A brief respite is expected on Friday until the next Low drops in from the northwest on Friday evening, bringing yet another shot of precipitation and reduced visibilities in rain / fog. The temperature climbs into the low 40's on Saturday.
