**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

The low departs, moving across the peninsula and into the Weddell Sea today. A period of weak high pressure begins, with lighter winds but continued snow showers through this forecast period. Another low center in the Bellingshausen will make the winds pick up a bit tomorrow morning, but not by much given its distance from Palmer.
