**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Colder and windier on the way – today a low exits the area and high pressure dominates for a while, but another low is aimed more directly at Anvers Island tomorrow, and will bring heavier snow and stronger winds through the day. Those winds coupled with falling temperatures mean the lowest wind chills of the season are likely, too.

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** 4-6 in snow, occasionally 1-2

**Wind (kts):** S-SW 20-25 gust 35 becoming variable 8-12

**Max Temp:** -2°C / 28°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -12°C / 10°F

**Sky:** Mostly Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, occasionally 4-6 in snow

**Wind (kts):** NE 10-15 becoming NE-E 20-30 gust 40

**Min Temp:** -5°C / 27°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -16°C / 3°F

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** 2-4 in snow, blowing snow, occasionally less than 1

**Wind (kts):** NE-E 30-40 gust 50-60

**Max Temp:** -2°C / 28°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -15°C / 5°F
