Expect a glancing blow from a low center this morning, with gust potential up to 60 knots as it circulates around the Bellingshausen Sea low, then strikes land southwest of Anvers Island. The Bellingshausen low will then make its way inland towards the Thwaites area, setting up a change in the weather pattern over the coming days. The first sign of that change will be the decrease in winds reflected in the latter part of this forecast.
