**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Deteriorating conditions through this period, as a low center makes its way eastward along the Antarctic coast into the Bellingshausen Sea. A trough extending north from that low will bring an increase in snow and stronger winds to the entire peninsula, including the Anvers Island area – though given the long distance from the actual low center conditions at Palmer are not expected to be extreme over the next couple days.
