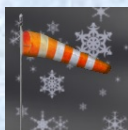
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

The cycle of wet and windy weather continues through the period. The next low barrels into Anvers Island later tonight, bringing another round of significant winds. Visibilities will fluctuate wildly as the sleet and precipitation move through the station. Temperatures will be fairly warm due to the persistent northerly winds, but wind chills will remain on the cool side.

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 3-5 due to mixed precipitation

Wind (kts): NW-NE 30-40, becoming NW-NE 10-20

Max Temp: 4°C / 39°F

Min Wind Chill: -9°C / 16°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 1-3 due to mixed precipitation, occasionally Unrestricted

Wind (kts): NW-NE 10-20 becoming NW-NE 40-50, gusting to 60

Min Temp: 0°C / 32°F

Min Wind Chill: -10°C / 14°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 2-4 due to mixed precipitation

Wind (kts): NW 20-30, gusting to 45

Max Temp: 3°C / 37°F

Min Wind Chill: -8°C / 18°F
