REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A bit of a blast continues today as a fairly strong low batters the coast. The center is crossing well to the south, but a tight pressure gradient persists up to and beyond the Anvers Island area – and that means big winds. Expect a break overnight, then another (but weaker) low approaches just to the north tomorrow.
