Relatively fast, moist westerly winds will propel minor systems quickly eastward through the southern Antarctic Peninsula and Drake Passage the next few days. This pattern means there will be periods of precipitation and minor fluctuations in temperature and wind, as small, difficult-to-time weather systems move quickly through Palmer.
