**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

A band of moisture, preceding a high pressure ridge approaching Palmer from the west, will bring a round of snow this morning. Generally fair weather is likely later today and tonight, as the ridge moves over the Antarctic Peninsula. Moisture will increase once again early tomorrow, ahead of an approaching cold front from the west.

**Visibility (SM):** 4-6 in snow, occasionally 1-2 early; becoming unrestricted with flurries this afternoon

**Wind (kts):** SW-NW 12-18, gusts to 28

**Min Wind Chill:** -12°C / 10°F

**Sky:** Partly cloudy early, becoming mostly cloudy late

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, becoming 4-6 in snow late

**Wind (kts):** NW 5-10 early, becoming N 12-17 late

**Min Temp:** -4°C / 25°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -15°C / 6°F

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** 4-6 in snow, occasionally 1-2

**Wind (kts):** W-NW 15-20

**Max Temp:** 0°C / 32°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -14°C / 7°F
