REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

An unusually large and powerful cyclone in the Bellingshausen Sea will stall and slowly weaken. Persistent brisk, moist, generally westerly winds will persist the next few days. A few small waves of low pressure upstream from Palmer may result in short periods of enhanced snow and winds, but these systems are notoriously difficult to time beyond about 12 hours.
