REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Relatively cool, humid, westerlies will continue to carry minor disturbances quickly eastward across the southern Antarctic Peninsula the next few days. A sharp low pressure trough will move east across Palmer this afternoon and evening, preceded by gusty winds and snow. A broader, weaker trough will approach from the west tomorrow afternoon.

Sky: Partly cloudy early, becoming cloudy

Visibility (SM): 3-5 in snow and mist, occasionally 1 or less

Wind (kts): NW 20-30, becoming NW-N 30-40 gusts to 55 this afternoon

Max Temp: -2°C / 28°F

Min Wind Chill: -17°C / 2°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 3-5 in snow and mist

Wind (kts): NW 15-25 early, becoming variable 5-10

Min Temp: -5°C / 23°F

Min Wind Chill: -16°C / 3°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 3-5 in snow and mist, occasionally 1-2

Wind (kts): W-NW 15-25

Max Temp: -3°C / 27°F

Min Wind Chill: -13°C / 10°F
